



## ENN GIVES BACK:



ENN, you answered the call!

When our Community Outreach Chairman Carol Goss put out a request for volunteers to place (and later, to remove) flags at Ft. Logan Veteran's Cemetery in Denver in the annual <u>Flags for Fallen Vets</u>, many of you stepped forward.

Ft Logan is one of eleven National Veteran's Cemeteries in three states where <u>Flags</u> <u>for Fallen Vets</u> places flags on the day before Memorial Day, to honor our essential fallen veterans who have helped to retain our freedom in America. This amazing organization places over 600,000 flags in those eleven cemeteries each year.

Led by our Activities Chairman, Frank McVeigh, our ENN volunteers joined others in placing 106,787 flags this year in all 86 sections of the 214-acre cemetery. The event drew 2500 Volunteers this year from around the state to place the flags and 70 volunteer Section Leaders to provide guidance and assistance.

We hope to have even more volunteers next year at this annual event!
