Mah Jongg is a tile based game that was developed in China during the Qing Dynasty. Similar to the Western card game Gin Rummy, Mah Jongg is a game of skill, strategy, and calculation but also involves a degree of chance.

The game is played with a set of 144 tiles based on Chinese characters and symbols. In most variations, each player begins by receiving 13 tiles. In turn players draw and discard tiles until they complete a legal hand. In North America, legal hands are created annually by the National Mah Jongg League. Cards are available annually for \$9 for large print card, \$8 for smaller card.

ALL ARE WELCOME! The leader has been playing Mah Jongg for about 5 years and is happy to both teach the game to new players and coordinate a weekly game for veteran players. Please email if you have an interest in joining the group.






BLACK DIAMOND SKIING



September 19th, Book Club #2 met at the home of Sandy Illich to discuss "Cutting for Stone" by Abraham Verghese.



Les Degustateurs fine wine group gathered for their September dinner at the home of Carrie Garczynski. Carrie served unique and extraordinary wines from Spain, including Txacoli, Godello, Rioja, Taganan Tinto, and Sherry. Carrie is pictured here pouring Txakoli (pronounced Chacoli), a slightly sparkling, very dry white wine with high acidity and low alcohol content produced in the Spanish provinces of the Basque Country, Cantabria and northern Burgos. Pouring wine from high above the glass creates wonderful effervescence and helps to release aromas in the wine.

The Spanish wines were served with delicious charcuterie, crab crostini, steamed fish and potatoes.

Les Degustatuers meet every other month to enjoy and become educated on fine wines from around the world. During 2019, the group has enjoyed wines from France.

Portugal, and Italy, and done cross tastings of varietals like Pinot Noir and Bordeaux blends to compare and contrast the same wine from different winemaking regions.

On September 23rd we met at the home of **Donna Lomax**. **Barb Conroy** presented her very interesting mini-bio. **Cindy Latham** facilitated a compelling screen presentation about the need for **fire mitigation in the Evergreen area**. She shared a video made by a woman as she drove her family through the fire in Paradise, CA to get them to safety.

There are frightening parallels between the Paradise community and our own. We too, have very limited exits if there is a need to evacuate. We are not prepared to fight or prevent the spread of fires and, historically, we are long overdue for a major fire. Evergreen is at the top of the list for fire risk in Colorado and in the Nation. The presentation



revealed our need to make evacuation plans in case of fire and our urgent need to do what we can to prevent a fire. Thank you Donna, Barb and Cindy for making this meeting so meaningful.


