

# Membership Enrollment and Renewals Now Online!



ENN has contracted with Cheddar Up to collect information and payment online. We used it with great success for the summer party in June and we will be using it for membership enrollment and dues starting in July.

### Some background:

- -Cheddar Up is used by smaller organizations to collect money and information. Boy and Girl scout troops, PTAs and sports organizations are using it for membership dues, spirit wear, outings, events and fundraising.
- -Cheddar Up is easy to use. You do not need to set up an account or app (like Venmo). A link to a secure page, specifically for ENN, will be provided in an ENN email or from our website.
- -Cheddar Up is secure and PCI compliant (short for Payment Card Industry Security Standards Council compliance). Financial data is sent directly and securely to their payment partner, Stripe. If you are not familiar with the name, Stripe is used by large

and small retailers everywhere, such as Amazon and farmer's market sellers.


Dues for the 2022-2023 year are due September 1.


# PIECEMAKERS QUILTING Sandy Illich - Leader
